

The Royal Military Police Central Benevolent Fund (CBF) was established by Charitable Trust Deed on 31 January 1944, was amended in January 1993 and again in June 1998.

The Trust's objectives are:

- to maintain or to increase the efficiency and esprit de corps of the Royal Military Police; and
- in the assistance or benefit of any such person serving or having at any time served in the Royal Military Police or being dependents, wives, widows or issue or persons in the Royal Military Police as may for the time being be in need of charitable assistance or benefit.

Funding for the CBF is derived primarily from annual contributions of a day's pay from all serving members of the Royal Military Police (RMP), other donations, legacies and investment income.

Applications for benevolent grants to serving members of RMP may be made direct to the Regimental Headquarters or through the Unit Chain-of-Command. All other applications are made through the Soldiers', Sailors' and Airforce Association (Forces Help) and the Royal British Legion.
